 Design and construction

Project scope

The O'Neil Group contracted Wiley for the transformation of a tired and traditional beachfront property, into a four-star venue.

Wiley delivered an elegant venue featuring:

- 8,819m² accommodation comprised of 80 high quality apartments and hotel suites
- Reception facilities
- Retail shops, café bars and restaurants
- A swimming pool, lifts, secure parking and guest's laundry

Project challenges:

- Devising a viable redevelopment solution for the client, who had been unsuccessful in previous attempts to redevelop the hotel.
- Accommodating environmental requirements for sympathetic use of the unique foreshore site, maintenance of the town's village atmosphere and height restrictions on the building.
- Collaborating with the client, local authorities and residents; revising the design to allay community objections to the proposed height of the building.
- Designing quality rooms to achieve the client's target for room tariffs
- Constructing the project with a limited workforce and on a tight budget
- Working to a short project schedule, with completion before a high season opening
- Applying strict project management processes to minimise the effect of days lost, due to inclement weather

Business value to client

The project was completed in time for a high season opening and under budget, with 3% of the total project cost saved.

The refurbishment allowed 22,000 more tourists to stay on the mainland each year, benefiting local and regional economies.
