Toowoomba Hospital kitchen replacement

Queensland Health provides a range of services to achieve good health for all Queenslanders. Toowoomba Hospital is a major regional hospital built in 1880 and is heritage listed. The hospital serves around 300,000 people in the Darling Downs area and the population is expected to grow to 386,000 by 2036. The hospital staff have been caring for their community in a facility where locals have both been both born and then treated throughout their lives.

- Initial infrastructure, construction, and asbestos

Project scope

The hospital required a new, high-hygiene kitchen facility with modern equipment and improved layouts and efficiencies to cater for over 1,000 meals per day.

Wiley delivered a full working kitchen, including hot kitchen, salad/sandwich prep room, plating line, cold rooms, freezer room, dishwasher area, stores, loading bays and associated staff office facilities.

The new kitchen building is 1,125m² on the ground floor with 233m² central plant rooms located on the first floor. A new enclosed link corridor provided direct trolley access from the new kitchen building to the existing Medical Block building.

The connection to the central bank of lifts enabled efficient food distribution throughout the hospital. This involved reconfiguration and refurbishment of the existing Place of Prayer and staffroom facilities within the existing Medical Block.

Large amounts of unknown in-ground services were discovered, including redundant and live asbestos pipes. Wiley proactively provided solutions to these issues and carefully managed the containment and removal of the asbestos.
